Mountain of the Temple of the LORD (1-2)

History of this Mountain

The Perfect Sacrifice (Genesis 22:2; 12-14)

The Place for God's Temple (I Chronicles 22:1 / II Chronicles 3:1)

Highest of the Mountains

Physically above all other mountains? (Isaiah 40:3-5 / Revelation 6:14)

Prominence above all other mountains? (Zechariah 14:16-17)

Many peoples will come streaming to the Mountain (2-4)

Invitations given by many

The opportunity to be in His presence (James 4:8 / Jude 24)

The opportunity to see His dwelling

Instruction given

Learning His ways (Matthew 11:28-30)

Learning His paths – with a desire to follow (Psalm 37:4)

Influential leadership

His Law = His Word (Matthew 5-7)

His justice – disputes settled by righteous decree
