God Keeps His Covenant

Crooked roads (1-8)

Surely God is able (Jude 23)

Separated from God – the result of sin (I John 1:5-9)

Stained with blood (James 5:4-6)

Speaking lies (John 8:44)

Swift to sin (Romans 3:15-18)

Seeking a crooked path (Jeremiah 6:16)

Confessing who we truly are (9-15)

Righteousness and justice are far from us

Shadows and darkness define our paths (I John 2:9-10)

Stumbling because of our blindness

Sins abound testifying against us (Jeremiah 8:7-12)

Rebellion and treachery define us (I Samuel 15:23)

Truth is nowhere to be found (Amos 8:11-12)

True justice is absent, bringing displeasure to our LORD (Lev. 19:36/Pr. 20:10)

Covenant of Promise (16-21)

He alone worked salvation (Acts 4:12)

He put on righteousness (Ephesians 6:14 / Romans 13:14)

He will repay His enemies (Romans 12:17-21)

He will make His name known (Philippians 2:9-11)

He will come to Zion – to those who repent (I Thessalonians 1:9-10)

What has God promised us and why are His promises our only hope? (John 3:16; 5:24; 14:1-3 / Romans 8:26-29 / I Corinthians 15:58 / Ephesians 1:13-14 / Philippians 1:6 / I Thessalonians 4:16-17; 5:9 / Hebrews 13:5 / II Peter 1:3-4)
